1. News Briefs & Important Due Dates:

November is Native American Heritage Month: The first American Indian Day in a state was declared on the second Saturday in May 1916 by the governor of New York. Several states celebrate the fourth Friday in September. Presently, several states have designated Columbus Day as Native American Day, but it continues to be a day we observe without any recognition as a national legal holiday. In 1990 President George H. W. Bush approved a joint resolution designating November 1990 "National American Indian Heritage Month." Similar proclamations, under variants on the name (including "Native American Heritage Month" and "National American Indian and Alaska Native Heritage Month") have been issued each year since 1994. 5. Bits and Pieces:

Congratulations to San Carlos Apache Housing Authority (AZ) and Rural Community Assistance Corporation (CA) who were among twenty three (23) organizations to receive grants to finance affordable housing under the new Capital Magnet Fund. Of the 23 awardees, 13 are nonprofit housing organizations, 9 are Community Development Financial Institutions (CDFIs), and one (***San Carlos Apache Housing Authority***) is a tribal housing authority. Established by the Housing and Economy Recovery Act of 2008, the Capital Magnet Fund drew applications from 230 organizations requesting more than \$1 billion in funds. The recipients are based in 14 states, but 38 states as well as the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico will potentially be served. Morongo Awards \$40,000 in Scholarships: Four college and graduate students in California have received a total of \$40,000 in scholarships from the Morongo Band of Mission Indians. These annual scholarships, named for late tribal member Rodney T. Mathews Jr., are open to members of any federally-recognized tribe in the state. Terria Smith from the Torres Martinez Desert Cahuilla Indians reservation in the Coachella Valley was awarded \$10,000, half of which she will receive this semester and the second half next summer after a check of her grades. Smith, 31, is a graduate student in journalism at the [University of California](#), Berkeley. The Morongo scholarship is in its sixth year and, according to a news release from the tribe, 20 students overall have been awarded \$200,000. The release says Mathews, a graduate of Hastings Law School, died in 2004. In addition to Torres Martinez, this year's scholarship recipients are from the Yurok, Cold Springs Mono and Hoopa Valley tribes. One is a psychology student at Humboldt State University, another is studying to be a firefighter at a community college in Fairfield and a third is working on a doctorate in Native American studies at UC Davis.

Soboba Indian Reservations getting “Smart Meters”: Soboba tribal members who live on the reservation will soon have the means to monitor their electricity consumption in real-time, giving them an opportunity to tweak their watts to hold down costs. Southern California Edison, which serves the San Jacinto-area reservation, is in the process of installing SmartConnect meters at all of the homes there. Unlike traditional meters, the smart mechanisms can be accessed from most two-way communications devices, including mobile phones and laptop computers, providing users instantaneous information about how much electricity is being used, according to SCE. Soboba is the first Tribal Nation (in California) to participate in the Edison SmartConnect program. “Smart meters will allow us to better serve our tribal community by utilizing Edison’s state-of-the-art technology,” said Soboba Tribal Councilwoman Rose Salgado. SCE plans to install the meters in 5 million homes and small-businesses within its 50,000-square-mile service area by the end of 2012. “SCE anticipates customers’ use of the information provided by the new meters will reduce demand on the electricity grid by about 1,000 megawatts — the amount of energy produced at an average power plant,” the company said in a statement. Fort Mojave Jail to house city inmates: Bullhead City offenders could be sent to a detention facility on the Fort Mojave Indian Tribe reservation. The deal will save Bullhead City taxpayers \$21 per day per prisoner and \$15 on the initial booking fee if it diverts its inmates from the local county jail to the one on the reservation, said Bullhead City Manger Toby Cotter. The tribe unanimously approved the deal and intergovernmental agreement with the City, Cotter said. Cotter stressed that inmates would still be processed in the local county jail for arraignment and other court proceedings but the city will now have the option to save the money by having inmates serve out their sentences at the reservation jail. Bullhead City, located three miles away from the gambling city of Laughlin, Nevada, expects to need 9,000 incarceration days arising from crimes committed in the city during the next 12 months and could incarcerate four to six inmates at a time at the reservation jail depending on availability, Cotter said. “It’s something we see as a great partnership,” Cotter said. “They have some capacity and we have the need.” For the full story, visit <http://www.indiancountrytoday.com/national/southwest/Indian-jail-to-house-city-inmates-106312823.html>

Tribal Building Code Survey: HUD SWONAP and the US EPA Region IX are working together to survey Tribes in the southwest region regarding the type(s) of building codes utilized for tribal development and whether or not the codes are adopted in place, such as the International Building Code or some other state building code. In addition, the HUD and EPA staff would like to know if those building codes include green elements and/or elements that are of a culturally sensitive nature to Indian country or to specific tribes. The results will be integrated into the development of template model green building codes that will integrate cultural aspects.
